

Bee Removal/Relocation by Ken Miller

Information Sheet

Why should you hire me to solve your bee problem?

For many the answer is, “SAVE THE BEES!” However, there are other serious considerations:

- 🐝 A pest control operator only kills the bees. This quickest solution frequently causes several expensive problems:
 - A surprisingly large amount of bee products are left in your structure: Honeycomb, three different stages of baby bees, frequently gallons of honey, raw flower nectar, plant pollen, a sticky tree resin product called propolis, and potentially tens of thousands of dead bees.
 - All the above will begin to rot attracting additional pests such as mice, rats, roaches, ants, crickets, even skunks and raccoons.
 - In our summer heat the comb will melt and often seep into your living space through ceilings and walls, and ruin carpet.
- 🐝 As a craftsman experienced in all residential construction trades, I will cut into your building with knowledge as to how it was built and consideration about the necessary repair. I have built my own home (I actually built it from the ground up.) and two churches in Arizona—I know what I’m doing when I go after your bees.
- 🐝 I’ll let you help. Since my calling and career is as a church pastor (I’ve been Sr Pastor of Beaver Creek Baptist Church since 1991.) I’m thrilled to share and teach. I have extra protective gear, and will be happy for you to observe up close, or actually assist.

After my departure with your bees, you may have questions about, “What’s next?” Here are a few common issues:

- 🐝 **Stragglers:** There will likely be bees left behind. During the first 24 hours they may be grumpy, as their home was just demolished and hauled away. Most commonly they just act confused. In a couple of days they should get adopted into another nearby colony.
- 🐝 **Reconstruction, Why I don’t do it:** You are paying me \$55.00/hr. After the bees are gone, you can hire from a multitude of craftsmen who will probably be happy with half my rate. (If you really want me to repair your project, let me know up front, so I can schedule sufficient time.)
- 🐝 **Reconstruction Details:** The main points to consider during reconstruction are removal of any remaining bits of comb, and reducing the attractiveness of the cavity. Fiberglass insulation is a great deterrent. Place it to fill the 24” of the cavity nearest the outside entrance. In the case of ground boxes, steel wool works very well to plug the hole in the lid.
